Universal	<p>Approaches aimed at everyone in the population that are designed to impact individual factors that increase the likelihood of being a victim or perpetrator of SV.</p> <p><i>Example:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Develop, implement, and evaluate a comprehensive faith-based educational program with multiple sessions and clear outcomes that will teach persons about sexual violence and dispel the rape myths, attitudes and beliefs that condone sexual violence. Evaluate and implement effective curriculum on dating and sexual violence delivered to high school students in grades 9-12. 	<p>Approaches aimed at everyone in the population that are designed to impact factors that increase risk of SV as a result of relationships with peers, intimate partners and family members.</p> <p><i>Example:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Develop, implement and evaluate a program for all little league coaches to build/develop skills to interrupt and address athletes inappropriate comments and behaviors that promote a climate condoning bullying, sexual harassment and sexual violence. Develop, implement, and evaluate in partnership with a local PTA, a skill-building program for parents to help them address attitudes and behaviors in their children that promote sexual violence. 	<p>Approaches aimed at everyone in the population that are designed to impact community and social environments that increase risk of sexual violence.</p> <p><i>Example:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Implement and enforce sexual harassment policies for schools, workplaces and other institutions. Help communities implement environmental safety measures such as ensuring adequate lighting and emergency call boxes are installed and working. This is complemented with community education and the enforcement of policies that prohibit inappropriate behavior such as stalking, threatening or coercing community residents. Hold annual meetings or press conferences to alert communities about the latest statistics regarding sexual violence in order to rally support for prevention activities. 	<p>Approaches aimed at everyone in the population that are designed to impact the larger, macro level factors that influence sexual violence, such as gender inequality, religious, cultural, social or economic factors</p> <p><i>Example:</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Conduct strategic planning activities with partners and policymakers using data from a variety of sources such as emergency rooms, crime reports, rape crisis centers, etc. to help determine where, when, and to whom prevention activities should be focused. Promote and enforce full implementation of the Title IX law. Establish and enforce policies for colleges and universities to accurately report sexual violence on campus and provide rape prevention programs to students and staff.
